I have a question about my SBMH/MHSP grant. Who should I contact?

As you continue to implement your School Based Mental Health (SBMH) or Mental Health Service Professional (MHSP) grant projects, you may have some questions regarding when to contact the technical assistance center (METRICS) as opposed to your US Department of Education Federal Project Officer (FPO). Please keep in mind, your FPO is your first line of contact regarding your grant; however, there are some technical areas in which METRICS is particularly well-suited to provide assistance.

Here are some guidelines to help you decide who to contact:

Questions about data collection or data analysis

Questions related to credentialing of school mental health practitioners

RECRUITMENTAND RETENTION ADVICE

Best practices and resources to promote recruitment and retention of a school mental health workforce

INDIVIDUAL HELP

Individualized assistance to promote meeting grant targets and support continualcontinuous improvement
